- Using an expansive vocabulary with them maybe have an interesting 'word of the week' to explore at home
- Encouraging community activities and out of school hour's opportunities but also ensure they have downtime to just play, enjoy their family and rest
- Being the best role models, you can be to your children.

School Council Nominations

Nominations for School Council will open on **Monday February 19th**. Our existing School Council comprises 6 parent representatives, 2 staff representatives (in the school employee category), 2 optional community representatives, and the Principal. Members of the School Council serve a two-year term, with the option to renominate at the conclusion of their term. Annually, three parent positions and one school employee position become available.

The School Council is obligated to convene a minimum of eight times per year, with meetings scheduled on Mondays at 6:30 pm. If you are interested in becoming involved, consider nominating yourself! 2024 Student Leadership Roles

Leadership is a quality that all students at Birregurra Primary School are encouraged and supported to develop. Students from Prep to Year 6 take on the role of leaders of their own learning. Through the curriculum and extracurricular activities, all students are encouraged to develop the skills necessary to be a leader. This ensures that all students perceive themselves as leaders and have the opportunity and confidence to take on leadership roles.

Embedded in our extra-curricular program are formalised student leadership roles. Through their actions Birregurra Primary School's student leaders will reflect and demonstrate the School's Values; Community, Aspire, Respect & Excellence in all of their actions, words and endeavours.

The 2024 leadership roles are School Captains, House Captains (Sladen, Strachan, Skene & Beal) and Junior School Council representatives including President, Vice President and Secretary.

Our 5/6 students will shortly begin writing their applications and deliver their speeches to the school community on **Monday 12**th **February @ 9:00am** in the Multi-Purpose Room. We are looking forward to hearing our young leaders speak about their personal qualities and skills and are confident they will all do a fabulous job. Parents are welcome to come along and listen to the speeches. Our Junior School Council also has representatives from Grades 3 & 4. Interested year 3 & 4 students will deliver their speeches to their individual classes.

Polwarth & House Sports Dates



The date of our annual Polwarth Interschool Sports has been set for **Thursday 29**th **of February**. For new families, the Polwarth Sports is a rural school sport's day held at Alvie PS each year for all students Prep to 6. Students from six local rural schools compete against each other in a range of athletic activities. Students in the older years who perform well at the Polwarth Sports can qualify to compete in the Colac Division Athletics. Typically, we would hold our own school House Sports prior to

Polwarth, however the Polwarth event has been moved forward this year due to NAPLAN taking place in March and the Colac Division Athletics scheduled for **Thursday 7th March**. Therefore, our House Sports will take place on **Wednesday 27th March**. To prepare students for the athletics, they will practice in their PE/Sports sessions with Mr King and be supported by our House leaders once elected.

Please note, the Polwarth Sports Day requires parents to transport their children to and from this event. This is due to the fact that all staff arrive bright and early in Alvie to help with the setup. All our staff including education support staff are allocated a role on the day, either running an event, age group official, scorer or first aid officer. Families are welcome to stay and enjoy the day, and we encourage you to bring along a picnic lunch. Please stay tuned for specific times including arrival and dismissal.

Lunch Orders

This week, we begin lunch orders through the Birregurra General Store as a service for our families. Lunch orders will run on Fridays with orders to be submitted by 9:00am Thursday morning. Unfortuantely no late orders will be accepted. Our school uses the Quickcliq online platform to order lunches. Please see instructions in today's newsletter on how to place your orders.



The lunch order menu is also included below and includes a traffic light system. Foods are classified as GREEN, AMBER or RED according to their nutritional value. Foods in the GREEN category are the healthiest choices. AMBER foods should be selected carefully and should only be eaten in moderation. Foods in the RED category are not essential. If they are consumed too often, or in large amounts, they can lead to weight gain and chronic diseases.

Parent Payments 2024

At Birregurra Primary School, we are mindful of costs for families and strive to keep fees as low as possible. Our parent payment contributions were endorsed by school council last year. For 2024, Parent Payment Arrangements will be \$280 per student. This amount covers all necessary items for the year, including exercise books, handwriting books, stationery, paper, whiteboards, art materials, etc., as well as access to a one-to-one digital device. We are very fortunate that the amazing fundraising efforts of our school community supports the purchase and updating of these devices.

In addition, our 2024 Parent Payment Arrangements also includes our whole school swimming program (Term 2), Life Education incursions, and online subscriptions. Our ability to offer these additional benefits relies on our strategic use of all funds, including locally raised funds, and on families fulfilling their curriculum contributions.

We would appreciate if Parent Payments can be made by the end of Term 1. Payments can be made via direct deposit, EFTPOS at the office or via credit card using the XUNO platform. If you wish to set up a payment plan, this can also be arranged by contacting Mrs. Leigh in the office.

Reminders

- Prep students do not come to school on Wednesdays throughout February.
- Our Welcome BBQ is this Wednesday @ 5:00pm. We'd love for you to join us!
- Please complete all start of year consent forms via XUNO by February 10th. Thanks to those that have already done this!
- Please provide an updated Asthma, Anaphylaxis and/or allergy plans as soon as possible updated plans are required every twelve months.
- Students and parents moving to cars should use the nature strip or circular footpath to access their cars.
- If you, or your child, are riding scooters or bikes to school, it is a requirement that you <u>all</u> wear helmets. It is important that we model the expected road safety laws and behaviours to our students.
- Classes start at 9am sharp. We would appreciate it if children can arrive at school between 8.40am and 9am. We understand that sometimes things don't always go to plan however late arrivals can disrupt student learning time.

- > Students arriving after 9am should report to the office first to sign in as a late arrival.
- Please note that the school yard is not supervised until 8.40am each morning. We ask that students arrive after this time. If a student needs to arrive before this time for some reason, please contact us to let us know. Before school care is available in the Multi-Purpose room with TheirCare. Bookings available at https://theircare.com.au
- > School finishes for students at 3.15pm. It would be greatly appreciated if you could ensure you are here at this time if you are picking your child/ren up. If you are running late, please give us a call. We are always willing to help out. The students will be supervised in the main building until you arrive.
- It would be great if all dogs were kept on a leash and preferably kept out of the school grounds.

Hello and welcome to another year.... with an extra big welcome to our new families at Birre in 2024!


