Staffing Update




Harmony Day

Harmony Day (Thursday 21 March 2024) is part of <u>Harmony Week</u> that celebrates Australia's amazing cultural diversity. During this week, schools celebrate inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for all Australians, from the traditional custodians of the land to those who have come from many countries around the world.

With its motto 'Everyone belongs', Harmony Day is a day we appreciate our differences and similarities, promote inclusiveness and show mutual respect for everyone, regardless of race, colour, religion, or background. On Thursday, students will engage in Harmony Week lessons and are invited to wear orange. This can include an orange t-shirt or shorts, or it could be an orange ribbon, or socks. Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Week. Traditionally, orange signifies social



communication and meaningful conversations. It also relates to the freedom of ideas and encouragement of mutual respect.



National Ride 2 School Day

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Passionfruit slice

I love passionfruit and given they are in abundance at the moment I thought it timely to share this easy passionfruit slice recipe. It's an easy straight forward recipe with simple steps and one that would be fun to make with the kids! - Brendan King



8 Ingredients

- Melted butter, to grease
- 150g (1 cup) self-raising flour
- 85g (1 cup) Coles Desiccated Coconut
- 100g (1/2 cup) caster sugar
- 100g butter, melted
- 1 x 395g can sweetened condensed milk
- 125ml (1/2 cup) fresh lemon juice
- 2 tbsp passionfruit pulp

3 Method Steps

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Brush a 16 x 26cm (base measurement) slab pan with melted butter to lightly grease. Line the base and 2 long sides with non-stick baking paper, allowing the sides to overhang.
- 2. Use a wooden spoon to combine the flour, coconut, sugar and butter in a large bowl. Use your hands to bring the dough together in the bowl. Transfer to the prepared pan. Use a metal spoon to press firmly over the base. Bake for 12 minutes or until light golden. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Reduce oven temperature to 150°C. Use a balloon whisk to whisk together the condensed milk, lemon juice and passionfruit pulp in a large bowl until smooth and well combined. Pour into the pan and spread evenly over the base.

Bake in oven for 15 minutes until just firm to the touch. Set aside to cool completely. Cut into slices to serve and enjoy! For more recipes like this head to:


