

Grade 6 Graduation & School Concert

Our final stomp sessions will be this Friday. These sessions will be held at the hall to support students' familiarity with the stage and the running of concert night.

Our Grade 6 graduation and school concert will take place this ***Friday 12th of December***, beginning at 5:15pm with a picnic in the 'Yardz' next to the Birregurra Hall. Students and their families are invited to bring along a picnic rug and/or chairs and enjoy a picnic together. We ask that students then make their way around to the Strachan Street side entrance to the hall at 5:45pm. Families are to then enter through the front entrance of the hall. Our school concert will kick off at 6:00pm sharp, running for approximately 45 minutes. Following a short interval, we will commence the Grade 6 Graduation at 7:00 pm. Families are welcome to leave after the concert if they wish. Please note that space is limited, and the hall will be at capacity. We ask that any younger children please remain with their parents/families and not with the primary students. This will support a smooth running of class concert items.



Community Colour Run

We are looking forward to bringing our community together for our Community Colour Run on the final day of the school year for our students, ***Thursday 18th of December***. This event is open to the whole community, with kinder children, secondary school students and other community members welcome to attend. The cost is \$2 per participant, which covers the cost of the colour. This applies to all BPS students, kinder children, secondary students and community members. We would like cash brought to the office prior to the event. The event will begin at 2.30 pm.

It's highly recommended that participants wear clothing that they don't mind getting dirty. This could be old clothes that you have in your closet or something that you plan on using solely for the Colour Run. Wearing white clothing can make the colour really pop! If you would like to volunteer to assist with distributing the colour, please let us know.

School Council

Our final school council meeting of 2025 is being held tonight @ 6:00pm. School Council has been an exceptional team, made up of both parents and staff, all deeply invested in improving our school and facilities and ensuring that Birregurra Primary School is the best possible place for your children to learn, grow and play. They will continue their work together until March next year.

From 2026, parents, carers and community members who would like to join the school council need a working with children (WWC) clearance to nominate. If you are considering nominating for school council, and don't already have a WWCC, I encourage you to apply for a volunteer WWC check as soon as possible. This will allow for processing times, which are estimated to be from 3 to 12 weeks.

Please note that if you do not hold a WWC clearance, you will not be able to nominate for school council, so it is vital that you prepare in advance. Obtaining a WWC clearance is free for volunteers, and you can apply online at Service Victoria.

When applying for your volunteer WWC check, please nominate the Department of Education as the organisation you are working for.

If you already hold an employee WWC clearance, you do not need to obtain a volunteer WWC clearance to nominate for school council.

Current parents and community members of school council do not need to apply for a WWC check immediately. Current members only need a WWC clearance if their term ends and they wish to nominate or be co-opted again. For more information, refer to Ministerial Order 1280 (Constitution of Government School Councils) 2020.



Interoception and Self-Regulation



As a professional working the health and wellbeing space I have learnt about interoception; what it is and the importance of it.

Our bodies constantly send us messages through physical changes—our heartbeat speeding up or slowing down, our muscles tightening, or our breathing shifting. These sensations help us recognise our emotions and needs, such as feeling happy, anxious, hungry, or warm. The ability to notice and make sense of these internal signals is called **interoception**.

Developing strong interoceptive awareness helps children recognise rising emotions before they become overwhelming. When children build their interoception skills, they are better able to:

- regulate their emotions and responses
- stay calm and remain engaged in learning
- maintain positive wellbeing
- strengthen their overall academic performance


