

Year 5/6 Surf Lifesaving Day

This *Friday 24th October*, students in Years 5/6 will head to Lorne Beach for an exciting Leadership Day focused on surf lifesaving. They'll learn about nippers, beach safety, and what it takes to become a surf lifesaver. Guided by qualified Bronze Medallion leaders and experienced surf lifesavers, students will take part in a variety of beach and water-based activities designed to build teamwork, confidence, and leadership skills.

Activities will include basic first aid, beach safety, identifying rips and currents, rescue board and tube practice, environmental sustainability and the marine environment.

Students are to arrive at school by 8:45 am and will return by 3:15 pm for normal dismissal. Please ensure students wear school uniform with bathers underneath.


Stress, Worry or Anxiety?


