### Changes to Digital Device Use

From 2027, the Victorian Government is introducing changes to the use of digital devices for students from Prep to Grade 6.

Under the new guidelines, schools:

- will no longer invite families to purchase or bring their own digital devices to use at school for Prep to Grade
- will follow new recommended digital device times, including minimal device time for Prep to Grade 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for grades 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures. They will also support students by reducing screen-time which can reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and reduced peer interaction. These reforms complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, ensuring an integrated approach to addressing digital distraction and the inappropriate use of technology.

#### What this means for our school

As you know, we provide school-owned digital devices for all students, so this change will not affect our current device provision.

Students with disability who use a digital device as a reasonable adjustment are exempt from these changes. These changes are intended to support families with cost-of-living pressures and reduce student screen time. 
#### Somers Camp 2026

The Somers School Camp 2026 Calendar has now been finalised, and our school has the opportunity to attend! In Term 1 2026 schools in our network "Barwon South & Colac" will have the opportunity to participate in a 'Somers Camp' available to 160 students in years 5 and 6 at a cost of \$350.00 per student. The camp will be held from Tuesday March 10 to Wednesday March 18 2026.

Somers School Camp (Somers Campus) is a Department of Education School offering a unique nine-day experience. The campus has been operating since 1959 with more than 180,000 children having attended.

Somers School Camp is an inclusive school where all students have the opportunity to develop confidence and independence, enhance their awareness of self, others and the environment and provides student the real-life opportunities to build their personal capabilities. The camp promotes respect, cooperation, communication and tolerance and provides leadership in outdoor education for both children and teachers.

Places are limited and further information including expressions of interest will be provided later this term.



#### Use of School Facilities Outside School Hours

A reminder that anyone using school facilities outside of school hours, including the basketball court and equipment, must do so safely and respectfully. ## **Victorian Virtual Emergency Department**



I recently discovered the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department. This service is free and open 24 hours a day 7 days a week and is available for children and adults to access. Patients require a mobile phone, laptop or desktop to automatically connect with a doctor or nurse for a video consultation

You do not need a referral from your GP, a Medicare card or an appointment to access Virtual Emergency Care through the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department.

You can contact Victorian Virtual Emergency Department for a range of conditions, including but not limited to:

- asthma
- fever
- cough
- vomiting
- diarrhoea
- injuries
- first trimester pregnancy bleeding.
