



SchoolMinds study



Researchers from Murdoch Children's Research Institute are interested in talking with children (with a parent present) who can share their views on how primary schools can support student mental health.

Around 14% of Australian primary school students have a diagnosed mental health disorder. Many more children experience mental health difficulties which affect their educational, social, and physical wellbeing.

Schools are an ideal site to support children's mental health. Murdoch Children's Research Institute is interested to know what children's perspectives are regarding how primary schools can support the mental health of students.

What's involved?

Your child would engage in 1-2 interviews at a location to be negotiated with you.

The interviews follow a semi-structured format and involve age-appropriate activities and games. Your child's participation in the interviews is voluntary and they have the option to withdraw at any time. One parent must accompany your child, although they will not be part of the interview process themselves.
