2024 Parent Payment Arrangements

Our 2024 Parent Payment Arrangements have been endorsed by school council. In our school, we are mindful of costs for families and strive to keep fees as low as possible. For 2024, Parent Payment Arrangements will be \$280 per student. This amount covers all necessary items for the year, including exercise books, handwriting books, stationery, paper, whiteboards, art materials, etc., as well as access to a one-to-one digital device. Families are not required to supply any of these items.

In addition, our 2024 Parent Payment Arrangements also includes our whole school swimming program, Life Education incursions, and online subscriptions. Our ability to offer these additional benefits relies on our strategic use of all funds, including locally raised funds, and on families fulfilling their curriculum contributions. Mobile Phone Policy

Our Mobile Phones Policy has been updated to include specific information regarding 'smart watches.' A smart watch is a watch with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. With an increasing number of students wearing these devices, it is important for families and students to understand the policy. Students who choose to bring smart watches to school can wear them; **however**, they must have them switched to 'school mode' or a similar setting during school hours. Students who use their personal mobile phones or smart watches inappropriately at Birregurra Primary School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing student engagement policies. HEALTH & WELLBEING

SLEEP AS A PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOUR

Over the course of the second semester, we have been implementing a new survey with our 4-6 students to track protective behaviours. Protective behaviours are those that have a positive influence on overall health and wellbeing.

The graphs below indicate a 3-week trend down in sleep patterns as a protective behaviour for our Year 4-6 students. This data has been collected from the Pivot Wellbeing survey we are currently trialling with year 4-6 students. I believe it timely to highlight this, given the importance of sleep for children, and the adverse effect lack of quality sleep has on learning, emotions and behaviour.


The data clearly indicates a downward trend in student's sleep habits and more interestingly it is observed that sleep is also the lowest recorded protective behaviour in each survey across the six domains recorded.


The impact of insufficient sleep on behaviour is profound, influencing mood, attention, and cognitive function. Primary age children, typically between 6 and 12 years old, require 9 to 12 hours of sleep per night for optimal health.

When sleep is compromised, children may exhibit irritability, difficulty concentrating, and emotional volatility. Additionally, a lack of sleep can contribute to behavioural issues such as impulsivity and hyperactivity. Consistent and quality sleep not only fosters physical growth but also supports the consolidation of learning and the regulation of emotions.


Parents and caregivers play a crucial role in establishing healthy sleep routines to ensure that children get the recommended amount of sleep for their age group.


